Appendix 2: City Cllr. Louise Gibbard: Report

Snack Shop- Planning

- There has been a lot of discussion in the community about the new 'Snack Shop' that opened in the former Coral bookmakers.
- Planning permission is being sought to retain its current use as retail (A1 class) and change from A2 which covered the bookmakers. The application also includes plans for the signage and roller shutter.
- The application can be viewed and any comments can be made online at http://property.swansea.gov.uk with reference 2024/1108/FUL deadline is 4th July

Black Boy Car Park

- A number of residents complained to me about parking tickets they have received recently in the Black Boy pub car park. They had erroneously been told that this was the responsibility of the Council. Whilst the Council has purchased the pub, (previously the Council only owned the land) as it represented a good investment opportunity with a long-standing and stable tenant to provide income, the Council has no jurisdiction over what rules or regulations are implemented in the car park.
- I have spoken to the Manager at the pub who also confirms this. The car park has been pay and display for some time as otherwise it was filling up with staff and customers of other businesses, especially the hairdressers/ barbers. It has recently switched to a number plate recognition system. The manager says there are 24 signs indicating you must pay to park, including a 6ft banner so they feel that this is well advertised. He said customers can still obtain a refund at the bar when paying for their food/ drinks.

'Ward Capital Scheme'

• Funds have been made available to each councillor to make improvements to Council owned assets. Cllrs Jeff and Mary Jones and I have met to discuss proposals for 3 schemes in Dunvant and Killay including teen facilities in Dunvant Park and highway safety. Further information to follow.

'Root Heave'

• Highways and tree officers are looking at a couple of instances of 'root heave' reported to me where the roots of mature trees have caused the pavement to lift on Broadmead and Wimmerfield and it has become a trip hazard. In case of Wimmerfield a small amount of root can be safely cut without damage to tree, but on Broadmead this won't be possible so tarmac has been smoothed out.

Wimmerfield Avenue/ Crescent

• Residents might be aware National Grid are renewing a faulty electric network cable that links the sub-station on Wimmerfield Crescent to the National Grid distribution network, the works were expected to take about 3 weeks. The footway between Goetre Fach Road and Wimmerfield crescent will be resurfaced full width.

Small Resurfacing Scheme

- Council highways will be back in the ward next month (likely w/c 29th July) to carry out small resurfacing around Dunvant and Killay where there is more extensive damage to the highway than pothole repair team can fix but it does not warrant a full resurface.
- I have put forward a number of suggested areas in Killay including list below, happy to suggest others if requested. Highways officers will prioritise those most in need this year:

o Dunvant Road between Derlwyn and Hendrefoilan Rd

- o Dylan Rd junction with Wimmerfield Drive
- o Parts of Goetre Fawr Rd (Near doctors surgery/ crossing)
- o Areas of Broadmead
- o Areas of Ridgeway
- o Areas of Woodcote
- o Ridgeway near Library
