Breakfast Club

- I am once again running weekly holiday Breakfast Club in Duvant Social Centre, open and free to all. Every Tuesday 8-10am, light breakfast and plenty of activities.

Friends of Duvant Park

- FODP quarterly meeting last week, volunteer day on Saturday
- Great developments funded by the UK Govt Shared Prosperity fund grant via SCVS with football pitch mown, lined and posts/ nets put up, permanent tennis net and lines for tennis & Pickleball and now table tennis table. Also been able to buy sports equipment (balls, racquets etc) and storage for them.

Super Saturday fun day - Saturday 27th July 10-2

- Funding from Swansea Council summer COAST fund
- Just Jump trampolining, girls football skills with Gower Galaxy, football shooting competition, pickleball taster, superhero characters, free pizza and juice, raffle and cake stall, all welcome

Free bus services

- Reminder that the free bus offer in the city is back for the summer holidays. It applies every Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday from Friday 26 July to Monday 26 August. From Friday to Monday all trips starting and finishing in the Swansea Council area are free until 7pm. This offer is for journeys that start and finish within the Swansea Council area. This is the area bounded by Loughor (Ship and Castle), Pontarddulais (Railway Station), Garnswllt, Clydach (Coed Gwilym Cemetery), Lonlas (Bowen Arms) and Port Tennant (Bevans Row) so it includes places like Gorseinon, Pontarddulais, Gower and Morriston.

No Cold Calling Zones

- I received a query from a Killay resident about designated No Cold Calling Zones, so thought I would share the info for awareness:

“No Cold Calling zones were introduced many years ago when there was a national drive to put these in place; you can't prevent someone or a trader from going into a zone or a particular area but by displaying some form of notice or sticker (which we previously had) may have deterred cold callers. The council was finding that signage etc that had been put in place for these areas was being vandalised and very costly to replace. Consumers can buy small notices online and display them on

their property but we haven't had any material for no cold callers in a long while. We do still have the zones highlighted on our website (but a number of years old) where consumers can download a notice but they would need a printer etc to do so.

Hendrefoilan Park, St Modwen

- Another meeting was held with St Modwen and residents local to Hendrefoilan Park development on 11 July unfortunately Cllrs Mary and Jeff Jones and myself were not told until that day and it clashed with full council.

Notes

Obstructive Parking Gower Rd

- Have received a number of complaints from residents regarding parking on the pavement due to builders vehicles on Gower Rd as you approach Olchfa School. Council enforcement officers have visited and can only enforce the yellow line, but have spoken to the builders. Have been in touch with PCSO who has also visited and will continue to monitor. If pedestrians are unable to pass safely or cars can not exit their drives they should call 101 and log.

Small Resurfacing Scheme

CWOT

- As usual have requested the team do a number of jobs in Dunvant and Killay area please send in any suggestions for cutting back/ weeding/ cleaning/ extra litter picking etc
- Killay areas this month included cut back of branches sticking out of hedge on Goetre Fach Rd, clearance of trapped litter under the hedge and removal of detritus building up

Fly Posting

- I received complaints about fly posting during the General Election. Unfortunately these were all on telegraph poles so council is not able to take any action but they were reported to BT.

Clyne Valley Mountain Bike Tracks

- It's been several years since the mountain bike trails known as Climb, Millers and Sanitised Strip in Clyne Valley Country Park were built – see attached map. Since then only ad-hoc maintenance works have been carried out on these trails by volunteers from Clyne Riders and others. These trails are now in a state of disrepair and the works required to bring them back into a good rideable condition are beyond the capacity of the volunteers. Using the “Sustainable Landscapes,

Sustainable Places” grant funding from Welsh Government, On Track have been contracted to undertake the works to bring the trails back into good rideable condition, as well as other works to clearly demark and segregate routes (renewed signage, way-marking and fences).

- The trail maintenance works will include digging of the surface (trail tread) and reconstituting the trail features using the re-dug material, culverts will be repaired/replaced where needed, and drainage channels will be reinstated and new ones created where needed – this will comprise a small J-shaped channel leading away from the trail where water can be held before dispersing naturally. The works will be undertaken using small machinery that will fit along the trails and handheld tools. No borrow-pitting will be undertaken. New post and fencing material will comprise composite material rather than wood, to provide longevity. A small area of Mill Lane car park will be used to temporarily store materials. The access track that leads to Keeper's Cottage and the

Old Railway Path will be used by the contractors to move materials and machinery/equipment to and from the trails in these areas; there will not be any need to close the routes and any movements would be kept to a minimum to avoid conflict with visitors using them.

- The works will not be creating new trails and maintaining only those shown on the attached map.
- There are a number of hazardous trees over and adjacent to the mountain bike trails that will need to be removed prior to works commencing. These have been assessed by an arboriculturist. An ecologist will be making an assessment for roosting bats and nesting birds, conducting any necessary surveys and gaining consent from Natural Resources Wales should a licence for bats be required.
- Hazardous tree removal will be undertaken in the coming months and we expect the work by On Track to start in September. During the tree removal works and trail maintenance works sections of the mountain bike trails will need to be temporarily closed for the safety of visitors and contractors.

Visitors should pay attention to any signage and instructions from the contractors working on site. Signage will be placed at key points around the Park advising visitors of the upcoming works and we will endeavour to have a timeline published ahead of works commencing. The works will not require the closure or diversion of any Rights of Way. The work may cause some disruption to visitors to the area, but this will be short-term and in the long-term will improve the experience for those using the mountain bike trails and adjacent Rights of Way by having better segregation.

- 1 day in Ridgeway – Wednesday 31st July
- The above are the areas being surfaced using the Large SRS resurfacing Gang to carry out largescale work.
- In addition, there will be another gang carrying out smaller work. This will be done on an ad-hoc basis, so I am unable to give you exact days. This Gang will be working in the following areas which were too small for the SRS Gang.

Appendix 3

Public Rights of Way Report August 2024 Cllr R Barrar

- RB on behalf of the Public Rights of Way Committee reported a long-standing issue with bridleway KI 107, located at the Ridgeway end of Woodcote, South Killay. It runs in between the football field and scrubby woodland. Over the years the grass and scrub has been allowed to grow over the bridleway making it difficult for horses and riders to navigate and thus are forced to move off the path and into the football field. This has understandably caused complaints by users of the football field. This, with the presence of a “No Horses” sign on the football field has discouraged horse riders to use it. An email was sent to Chris Dale, Manager of the Council Countryside Access Team requesting that the bridleway is cleared.
- In addition, an update was requested on the provision of signage, agreed over a year ago, at the beginning of KI113 where it begins North of Hendrefoilan Road at Lledglawdd Farm, and another at the junction of KI113 and KI114 indicating the newly reestablished footpath that runs towards Tŷ Coch.
